

### 115th Congress (first session)


- Senate plans to stay in session the first two weeks of August •

### **Congressional Activity – Calendar**

115th Congress (first session)


- FY 2017 ends on September 30, 2017
- Debt ceiling expires in mid-October per Congressional Budget Office
- Legislative Agenda for 2017
  - Appropriations Bills
  - FY 2018 Budget
  - NAFTA Renegotiations
  - FAA Authorization
  - Tax Reform
  - Affordable Care Act (??)



## **Congressional Activity – Appropriations Process**

### 115th Congress (first session)

- The House Appropriations Committee is on track to take action on all 12 appropriations bills before the August recess. Currently, the plan is to bundle them into "minibus" packages of 3-4 bills for eventual House floor passage.
- The Senate Appropriations Committee has marked up three bills so far: the Military Construction/VA bill, the Energy and Water bill, and the Agriculture bill.

## **Congressional Activity – Appropriations Bill**

115th Congress (first session)

### Fiscal Year 2018 Appropriations Bill for the USPTO

- Provides \$3.5 billion for the USPTO. Full access to projected fees.
- House Appropriations approved bill on \_\_; Senate considers on 7/27
- IP "Riders"
  - <u>Havana Club Trademark Provision</u>: a provision in the House CJS Bill would prohibit USPTO from using any funds "to approve the registration or renewal of, or maintain the registration of, a mark, trade name, or commercial name" that was used in connection with a business or assets confiscated in Cuba (Section 536)
  - Free Trade Agreements: a provision would prevent language from being included in future agreements that would allow patent owners to block parallel imports (pharmaceutical impacts)



### **Congressional Events**

115th Congress (first session)

#### Telework Enhancement Act Pilot Program (TEAPP)

- USPTO's TEAPP authority is set to expire in December 2017
- USPTO continues to engage Congressional staff on the benefits of telework and extending the program beyond its current expiration date

#### **USPTO Briefing on Geographical Indications (GIs)**

- USPTO in discussions with Congressional Trademark Caucus to provide a briefing on Geographical Indications
- USPTO will brief staffers before the WIPO General Assembly in October

115th Congress (first session)

#### USPTO Hill Staff Briefing on Recent Supreme Court Decisions on Intellectual Property

### (July 20, 2017) – Senate Dirksen Office Building

- USPTO provided a brief overview to Senate Judiciary Committee staff on some of the Supreme Court decisions issued this term and their legal and practical impact.
- The cases that were covered include *Matal v. Tam* (trademarks); *TC Heartland v Kraft* (venue); and *Impression Products v. Lexmark* (patent exhaustion).
- USPTO also provided a brief overview of the issues that will be argued next term before the Supreme Court relating to the USPTO's post-grant proceedings established by the Leahy-Smith America Invents Act.
