Subject: Software Patents

I am writing as software professional of 29 years to offer that I feel software patents, as currently issued are bad for the industry.

- 1. Software development seldom (if ever) involves the ammount of capital investment required to bring a physical process or invention to market. Therefore long term protection to recoup investment (one of the reasons for patent protection) does not apply to software, and never has.
- 2. Software based product lifetimes can be very short (often less than four years), which are far outshadowed by patent lifetimes.
- 3. Patents have been issued for software practices that are neither non-obvious nor novel.
- 4. Collection and cross-licencing of software patents by large corporations and speculators serve as a barrier to entry for smaller developers.

I believe all of the above have combined in ways that limit creativity, counter competitiveness, and stiffle innovation.
