I write regarding the examination guidelines for implementing the first-inventor-file provisions of the AIA. Indiana University urges the USPTO to adopt a "broad" construction of the First-To-Publish Grace Period Exceptions in AIA Section 102(b) subparagraph (B), instead of the currently proposed "narrow" construction of the scope of these FTP Grace Period Exceptions relative to the intervening disclosures of others. Such a construction is of great importance to the university community as a whole, and to Indiana University in particular, as it balances a university's need to quickly and widely disseminate scientific research with its ability to serve as a source of technology available for commercialization. To that end, Indiana University supports the comments submitted by AAU, the American Council on Education, the Association of Public and Land-grant Universities, the Association of American Medical Colleges, the Association of University Technology Managers, and the Council on Governmental Relations.
