



Example - Pads (102) and (105) should be considered adjustable since they are removed but replaced in a different configuration. Pad (104) should be considered removable since it is either added or removed and cannot be placed in another position. If the foot-supporting part also supports the foot with pads (102) and (105) removed, then classification in <u>A43B 7/1463</u> is also proper.
